


Dear participants in Sowing Hope for the Planet,



Amazoniza-Te/Amazonize Yourself



We would like to tell you about videos and an upcoming webinar planned for the Season of creation, the "Amazonize" awareness raising



project and beautiful new resources from our Portuguese speaking members. The Church and civil society organizations are launching

an awareness and care campaign for the Amazon called to "Amazonize yourself". This is an important effort for us to know what is happening in to the land and the people. The statements are available on our website in <u>EN</u>, <u>ES</u>, <u>FR</u>, <u>IT</u> and <u>DE</u>.

Amazonize yourself: Church and civil society organizations have launched an awareness and care campaign for the Amazon on July 27, the "Amazoniza-te" (Amazonize yourself) Campaign. Organized by the Episcopal Commission for the Amazon of the National Conference of Bishops of Brazil (CNBB) in partnership with other ecclesial and civil society organizations, the initiative appears sensitive to the context where violence against traditional peoples is aggravated by the Covid-19 pandemic. We are facing a situation where deforestation and land grabbing, fires, legal and illegal mining are being intensified, becoming agents of proliferation of coronavirus in the Amazon region communities.

There are **new resources in Portuguese** to help develop this theme available on our website such as <u>Breve Histórico Da Congregação Das</u>
<u>Servas Da Santíssima Trindade</u> and <u>Uma Prática Da Laudato Si</u>.
