Marist Asia Foundation serves Burmese Migrants on the Thailand Burma Border with Health, Education and Migrant Support **Programmes**

HIV AIDS Health Programme. In 2015 we supported 75 Adults / Children living with HIV AIDS

Education Programmes: In 2015 75 Burmese Migrant Preschool children, 95 Burmese Migrant Secondary Age children, 12 University Online Diploma students received a brighter future with education.

Migrant Support Programme: In 2015 English and computer classes were provided to help Migrant Workers gain skills for a brighter future.

In 2015 we did some incredible things



In 2015 the Health Programme provided 2.883 translation services in hospital, 1,264 home visits, 359 nutrition packs, 11 HIV Education workshops, 683 hospital visits.



In 2015 the Education Programme

100% of preschool graduates will start primary school in 2016. 34 new students began Yr1 and we had 83% retention rate Yr 4 students. 90% of Yr 4 students continued in English Programme. All 2015 Online University Programme graduates employed. 12 new students began Online University and have achieved high grades in 3 completed courses so far.



In 2015 the Migrant Support **Programme**

provided computer classes, english classes and developed the network relationship with Thai Government, Burmese Learning Centres -Teachers, and Catholic Social Services supporting Migrant Rights.



Achievements

Probably the greatest achievement is seeing 200 Burmese Migrant Children coming to the Marist Centre every day. Safe. Smiling. Enjoying learning. Growing in self confidence and hope. The more we learn about our students and migrant families the more we recognise the large obstacles and their hunger for education as a step to a brighter future


